

Invaluable for breeders of Siamese cats is the knowledge of what names in a cat's pedigree are examples of perfect characteristics. Every cat of good lineage has some fine characteristics, and type is produced by careful breeding.

Never mate a cat that has attained perfection in one characteristic with a cat deficient in that same characteristic. The names in a pedigree will reveal what may be expected from their descendants. Some of the cats whose names in a pedigree will contribute to achieving perfection of type are listed. Achieving perfection of type should be the goal of all conscientious breeders.

Prestwich Apollo is described as small of bone with a lovely head and eye color: a cat of outstanding type.

Prestwick Puji's characteristics: a beautiful head and eyes, very dense points, and a coat of fine texture. The body type was lithe and dainty.

Prestwick Perzephon in his early days had eyes of a magnificent blue, and the shape of the eye was very fine. He also had a lovely head and a well shaped body.

Prestwick Pitapat, a beautifully dainty type, had a very fine head and lovely color in the well shaped eyes.

Champion Prestwick Perling had the right type wedge-shaped head. Her points were deep seal brown. The color of the coat was warm and lovely and the texture excellent. Her body type was dainty. She also possessed beautiful eye color.

Hoveton Sinbad was outstanding for his eye color and the shape of his eyes. His head was of beautiful contour.

Wivenhoe Patini was small and dainty. She had very dark points. Her head and eyes were beautiful. Her body type was excellent and the texture of the coat was soft and glossy.

Penybryn John's outstanding characteristic was gorgeous eye color.

Longham Kaguya had a finely shaped head and excellent eye color. Her tail and body were of symmetrical proportion.

The champions that every breeder

would like to see listed in her cat's pedigree are:

Champion Simzo closely duplicated the fine characteristics of his famous sire, Champion Bonzo.

Champion Bonzo outdistanced all other Siamese cats in England. He had a beautiful body, his head was long and of perfect shape, and he had almond shaped eyes.

Champion Simple was known for her beautiful head. The eyes were lovely in color and of perfect shape.

Sealpoint Siamese cats never throw Bluepoint kittens after being mated to a Bluepoint Siamese cat unless the dam carries the blue gene. To carry the blue gene there must have been in the cat's ancestry a sire or dam descended from a Bluepoint cat.
